Some of our duties are:


- 1. Set up & clean up

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

Many hands make light work. We need lots of adults to help measure the kids for uniforms during the first week of band camp and then come back the next week when the uniforms are actually fitted. Interested? *Email us on the El Dorado Band Website. We are listed under Boosters and then click on uniforms.* We provide everything you need to do this very important job. It is also a great way to get to know all the kids.

UNIFORMS AND GROOMING COMMITTEE

Enjoying your summer? Soon it will be time for Band Camp and uniform fitting. It is very important that all students be fitted for marching uniforms during Band Camp. For those returning students, you already know the drill. For our new members or any of you who may have forgotten, please remember the following:

Since hair must be short enough to not hit the collar, please



consider your
hairstyle, as it will
look in about 6
weeks. You must
be able to pull hair
up into your hat or
have it short
enough for a little
skin to show above
your collar.

If you are planning on any new piercings, please remember that earrings and other facial jewelry must be removed for all performances. Band-aids are not the answer.

For actual performances, all students must be clean-shaven without makeup, jewelry or nail polish; NO exceptions.

You will be measured for your marching uniform during Band Camp. Please make sure you have acquired the following (what we call your "Band Whites") before then:

White V-neck (NOT crew neck) t-shirt WITH sleeves. You



can purchase these in packages of 3 at Wal-mart, Target, Kohl's or J.C. Penney for a reasonable price. Having 3 saves you time doing laundry during those busy weeks with multiple performances.

Black or navy blue shorts of lightweight material, NOT jean shorts. The best are basketball, running or PE shorts. These can also be purchased at the stores that have t-shirts as well as Big 5 or Sports Chalet.

Black nylon or nylon-blend socks. Cotton socks fade to purple, which clashes with the uniform. These can also be purchased at the stores mentioned above and a 3-pack would be a good idea for those weekends with a football game on Friday and parade and field show tournament on Saturday. Your fellow band members will appreciate your clean, sweet-smelling socks.

This may seem obvious, but for those who may be wondering: You are responsible for washing your t-shirt, shorts and socks after every performance.

If you have your Showstopper black patent shoes from last year, make sure they are spotless for inspection during measuring the first week of Band Camp. If you have outgrown your shoes and they are in good condition, you

can donate them back to the band. These will be passed on to students who may not have the resources to purchase new shoes.



New shoes will again be \$25. Shoes are ordered by the Uniform Committee.

You will be issued one pair of black gloves (included in your band fees). We encourage you to purchase an additional pair or 2 for emergencies for those weeks with multiple performances. At Band Camp, gloves are \$2 per pair. On the day of a performance, the same gloves will cost you \$5 per pair. You are responsible for keeping track

and washing your gloves after every performance.

& Colorguard will be travelling to Hawaii to participate in the 2011 Hawaii Invitational International Music Festival!

The Band and Colorguard will be taking this tropical adventure from April 16th through April 22nd, 2011. A trip such as this, with over 200 of our closest friends, requires much planning and preparation. It is still very early in the process and many details of the trip will come later, but here are a few highlights that we can all look forward to:

PHONE TREE

The Phone Tree is an automated messaging system that calls your phone. When you first answer the phone you will hear a chime, followed by the recorded message. Our messages will always by identified as coming from El Dorado Band

Boosters. If you don't answer in person and you have an answering machine, the Phone Tree will attempt to leave a message. When you are listening to the message you can have it start over by pressing the star (*) key before the message is complete. You can also check Phone Tree messages at any time on the web site calendar!
